

Glendale Memorial Online Pre-Registration and Pre-Op Testing

All patients scheduled for a procedure will need to pre-register and have a pre-procedure nursing assessment before their procedure date.

Pre-Register Online

If you are scheduled for a procedure, you can pre-register from a computer.

Online registration is quick and easy at:

Just go to “Patients & Visitors” and click on “Admitting and On-line Pre-Registration.”

When your online information is submitted, you will just have to sign some forms when you arrive for pre-op assessment.

Make Your Pre-Op Assessment Appointment

All patients scheduled for a procedure will need a pre-op assessment which may include Lab work, EKG and Chest X-ray. **Call (818) 502-7888 to make an appointment. You may leave a message and your call will be returned within 2 hours.**

Before Surgery

- You must not eat or drink any food or liquid, not even water, for up to 12 hours before surgery. **If you did consume any food or liquid, immediately inform your nurse and doctor.**
- Make sure you and your doctor/surgeon agree on exactly what will be done during the procedure.
- Tell the surgeon, anesthesiologist and nurses if you have allergies or ever had a bad reaction to anesthesia.
- Tell your doctor and nurse about all the medications you are currently taking, and when the last time you took these medications. *It is very helpful if you bring a written list.* Please include over-the-counter medications such as aspirin, ibuprofen, vitamins and herbal supplements.
- Show the person giving you medications your identification bracelet.
- If you have had a bad reaction to medicines or dyes in the past, tell your physician and nurse.
- Tell your nurse what language you speak/prefer to speak and what language you want written information in.

You will receive a call 1 business day before your procedure to confirm your scheduled arrival time.

Ask Questions

- Speak up if you have concerns. It is okay to ask questions and to expect answers you can understand.
- Take a relative or friend with you if this will help you ask questions and understand the answers.

After Surgery

- Let your nurse know if you have pain after your procedure.
- Make sure you have arranged for someone to give you a ride home. You will not be able to drive or leave by yourself.
